Entrance Antiphon: Psalm 16

To you I call; for you will surely heed me, O God; turn your ear to me; hear my words.
Guard me as the apple of your eye; in the shadow of your wings protect me.

First Reading: Exodus 17: 8-13

The Amalekites came and attacked Israel at Rephidim. Moses said to Joshua, 'Pick out men for yourself, and tomorrow morning march out to engage Amalek. I, meanwhile, will stand on the hilltop, the staff of God in my hand.' Joshua did as Moses told him and marched out to engage Amalek, while Moses and Aaron and Hur went up to the top of the hill. As long as Moses kept his arms raised, Israel had the advantage; when he let his arms fall, the advantage went to Amalek. But Moses arms grew heavy, so they took a stone and put it under him and on this he sat, Aaron and Hur supporting his arms, one on one side, one on the other; and his arms remained firm till sunset. With the edge of the sword Joshua cut down Amalek and his people.

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 120

Our help is from the Lord, who made heaven and earth.

- 1) I lift up my eyes to the mountains: from where shall come my help?
 My help shall come from the Lord who made heaven and earth.
- 2) May he never allow you to stumble! Let him sleep not, your guard. No, he sleeps not nor slumbers, Israel's guard.
- 3) The Lord is your guard and your shade; at your right side he stands. By day the sun shall not smite you nor the moon in the night.
- 4) The Lord will guard you from evil, he will guard your soul.
 The Lord will guard your going and coming both now and for ever.

Second Reading: 2 Timothy 3

You must keep to what you have been taught and know to be true; remember who your teachers were, and how, ever since you were a child, you have known the holy scriptures – from these you can learn the wisdom that leads to salvation through faith in Christ Jesus. All scripture is inspired by God and can profitably be used for teaching, for refuting error, for guiding people's lives and teaching them to be holy. This is how the man who is dedicated to God becomes fully equipped and ready for any good work.

Before God and before Christ Jesus who is to be judge of the living and the dead, I put this duty to you, in the name of his Appearing and of his kingdom: proclaim the message and, welcome or unwelcome, insist on it. Refute falsehood, correct error, call to obedience – but do all with patience and with the intention of teaching.

Gospel Acclamation: Hebrews 4:12

Alleluia, alleluia!

The word of God is living and active; it probes the thoughts and motives of our heart.

Gospel: Luke 18: 1-8

Jesus told his disciples a parable about the need to pray continually and never lose heart. 'There was a judge in a certain town' he said 'who had neither fear of God nor respect for man. In the same town there was a widow who kept on coming to him and saying, "I want justice from you against my enemy!" For a long time he refused, but at last he said to himself, "Maybe I have neither fear of God nor respect for man, but since she keeps pestering me I must give this widow her just rights, or she will persist in coming and worry me to death."

And the Lord said, 'You notice what the unjust judge has to say? Now will not God see justice done to his chosen who cry to him day and night even when he delays to help them? I promise you, he will see justice done to them, and done speedily. But when the Son of Man comes, will he find any faith on earth?'

Communion Antiphon: Psalm 32

Behold, the eyes of the Lord are on those who fear him, who hope in his merciful love, to rescue their souls from death, to keep them alive in famine.

Reflection

The judge in this story only gives in to the distraught widow when she threatens 'to give him a black eye' (in the Greek)! Jesus is not saying God is like the judge who needs to be battered into submission. Jesus is saying we need to pray like that widow.

Think of what widows in Syria or Iraq are praying for tonight. Then think of one's own prayer. God is not the slightest bit interested in my usual trivial, self-promoting prayers. But He is interested in my being such a woeful pray-er and wants to change me.

Recall an incident of really urgent, intense prayer. Most likely, it was to do with a traumatic accident or fatal disease of a baby, of a spouse, of a parent too young. Apply that intense urgency to those in the world crying out: 'give us this day our daily bread'. In short, pray The Lord's Prayer with meaning. We could pause for a moment to pray to live

out the consequences of the 'Our Father' lest we are threatened with a black eye!


PARISH GIVING

In light of this, and with the desire to maintain the regular celebration of Mass across all our parish churches, I have needed to review and adjust both the weekday and Sunday Mass schedules. These changes also take into account that Father Vincent will be on annual leave during November. Upon his return in December, it is hoped that he will reside in Nowra, helping to strengthen fraternity and ministry across the parish.

As your Pastor, it is my responsibility to ensure that our Mass schedule is both sustainable and reliable. Therefore, the new timetable has been carefully constructed to operate effectively with only two priests. While at times we may have more than two priests available, we must always plan around the realities of annual leave, conferences, illness, and other ministry commitments. This approach ensures that the celebration of Mass can continue consistently and reverently across our parish, without sudden disruptions or last-minute changes.

Saint Peter To Rot Catechist and Martyr for the Faith (1912-1945)



Peter To Rot was born on an island off the northeast coast of Papua New Guinea, 5th March 1912. His parents were Angelo To Puia, a village chief, and Maria la Tumul, adult converts who were part of this region's first Catholics. .A devout young man, Peter had an intense prayer life and love of the Eucharist. At the age of 18, he became a lay catechist and ministered to the people of his own village. In 1936, at the

age of 24, he married Paula la Varpit, who was also Catholic. The couple had three children.

In 1942, the Japanese invaded the island and arrested all the missionaries. Peter continued to lead the village as best he could, caring for the sick, baptising, teaching the faithful, and assisting other catechists who were confused by the changes brought about by the Japanese who tried to get the people to return to their pre-Christian ways, and legalizing polygamy.

Peter openly opposed the regulations, and was arrested in 1945 for conducting religious gatherings. He was imprisoned in a cave. On the evening before his execution his wife Paula and their two children visited him. He had asked Paula to bring him his white laplap, his good shirt and his rosary beads. He wanted to face his persecutors dressed as a catechist. On July 7th 1945, Peter was given a lethal injection by his captors and died as a martyr for the faith. He was beatified in Port Moresby, PNG, on January 17, 1995 by Pope St John Paul 11, declaring the heroic virtue of the devout catechist. His canonisation was approved by the late Pope Francis, and he will be canonised on Sunday October 19th 2025 by Pope Leo XIV. **St Peter To Rot** pray for Catechists and all missionaries.
