Major Parish Updates

Welcome Fr James

Fr James grew up in Albion Park Rail as the eldest of three boys. He attended World Youth Day 2008 in Sydney as a Year 12 student, which was pivotal for his faith journey. That year, he first felt the call to the priesthood, but ignored it.



He went on to study Law and International Studies at the University of Wollongong, during which he also spent a year as an international student in Leon, Spain. Upon returning to Australia, Fr James wrestled with his faith and calling until he graduated from university, when he decided to enter seminary to further explore the call to priesthood.

After much discernment, Fr James realised this calling was the best path for his life and the best thing he could do for others and he personally committed his life to God.

After seven years in formation, Bishop Brian ordained James to the priesthood on 10 Dec 2022. Since then, Fr James has served in the Lumen Christi Parish Wollongong, and St Pauls Parish Camden, and has been chaplain to hospital, university, youth events like ACYF and WYD Portugal. He has also worked with CEDoW in schools ministry, regularly coordinates diocesan liturgical events, is a board member of CatholicCare, a member of the Diocesan Youth Council and a regular celebrant for Mass For You At Home.

In his spare time, he likes swimming, walks, fantasy books, history and politics podcasts, board games and video games, and a good flat white. He is also a celiac.

Fr James will commence his new appointment as assistant priest in Nowra parish effective the 12 Jan 2026.
